

Five Vie for two School Board seats

(Five candidates will be in the running for two school board seats in the September 13th election. Incumbents Polly Prior and Danny Peters are seeking re-election, and are joined by Eric Totemeier, Dave Duncan and Bob Reid in the quest for the two at-large seats. Following are responses from the candidates to a questionnaire sent by the Gazette. Also voters will be asked to approve a revenue purpose statement allowing sales tax funds to be used for school infrastructure purposes, allowing for property tax relief. Polly Prior
